

ORDINANCE NO. 204-94

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF BANCROFT, MICHIGAN,
ADOPTING AN ORDINANCE TO BE KNOWN AS :**

The Village of Bancroft Dog Ordinance

The Village of Bancroft Ordains:

SECTION 1. Purpose:

The purpose of this ordinance is to prohibit the keeping or harboring of dogs which are savage or vicious or a nuisance to the neighborhood, and to prohibit owners or harborer of dogs from allowing them to run at large, to provide penalties therefor and for the impounding of such dogs.

SECTION 2: Definitions:

The word "owner" as used in this ordinance shall include any person having property right in a dog(s) or who keeps, harbors, has in his or her car, or feeds habitually or allows to remain about his premises, any dog, as defined in Section 1 of the Dog Law of 1919 of the State of Michigan. The words "savage" and "vicious" shall be construed to mean any dog which shall have been shown to have attacked any person rightfully on the premises of the keeper or harborer of such dog or elsewhere, unless such attack has been incited by frightening, annoying, baiting or other provocation of such dog.

SECTION 3. Conditions Creating a Nuisance:

It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog(s) to allow the same to run at large in the Village of Bancroft outside the premises of such owner or harborer unless properly held in leash, or to keep or harbor in said Village any dog which is savage or vicious or a nuisance to the neighborhood by reason of barking, or yelping.

SECTION 4. Impounding or Seizure of Dogs:

The Police Officer of the Village of Bancroft is hereby authorized and directed to provide a suitable place for the impounding and humane keeping of all dogs seized under this ordinance, and will promptly notify the County Animal Control to pick up any dogs seized under this ordinance. The seized dog(s) shall then come under the control and jurisdiction of the County Animal Control Division, thus alleviating the Village Police of any further responsibility of the seized dog(s)

VILLAGE OF BANCROFT DOG ORDINANCE NO. 204-94 CON'T.

SECTION 5. Penalties:

Any person who is found to be in violation of this ordinance shall; on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of upto Fifty (50) dollars and/or any other such fines deemed appropriate at the discretion of the Court having jurisdiction.

SECTION 6. Conflicting Ordinances Repealed:

All ordinances previously adopted and inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed in their entirety, with reference being made to ordinance No. 115-54.

SECTION 7. Effective Date:

This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after its passage, as set forth hereafter.
